Move that Council direct the Economic Development Committee to begin discussions with the University of South Carolina as to the sale of the Innovista Parking Garage that USC is now interested in purchasing [PEARCE]: Council sent this item to the Economic Development Committee. ACTION: CLERK OF COUNCIL, ADMINISTRATION, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
- d. A resolution recognizing Booker T. Washington High School on its 100-year anniversary for the significant contributions made to our community [LIVINGSTON]: Council unanimously approved the Resolution. ACTION: CLERK OF COUNCIL

Move that the County Administrator assign a staff member to evaluate the possibility of either purchasing or leasing solar panels for all County owned buildings where the installation of this equipment would result in significant savings.
