ADOPTION OF AGENDA – The agenda was adopted as amended. Livingston added a Resolution for Consolidated Systems Inc. to First Reading Items. Larry Smith added land purchase and negotiations and a personnel matter to the Report of the County Attorney.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

- **a. S.C. State Archives Association to the Register of Deeds Office** Awards were presented to the Richland County Register of Deeds for innovation and excellence for the third year in a row.
- **Keep America Beautiful of the Midlands** Mary Pat Baldauf invited Council to Beach Sweep/River Sweep, September 20-22.

REPORT OF COUNTY ATTORNEY FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION ITEMS – The County Attorney stated that the items for executive session included Richland County vs. Burdell Fuller Road, PHA Proposed Lease Agreement, land purchase and negotiations, and a personnel matter.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Regular Session: September 10, 2002 – The minutes were approved as submitted.

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REPORT OF COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR – Mr. McSwain asked Council to consider changing the date of the December zoning public hearing because there would not be enough time to post information. Council voted to reschedule the zoning public hearing for January 28, 2003.

OPEN/CLOSE PUBLIC HEARINGS – Public hearings from Items 1h, 1i and 1j were opened and closed. Two people spoke for Item 1h, one person spoke for Item 1i, and no one spoke for Item 1j.
