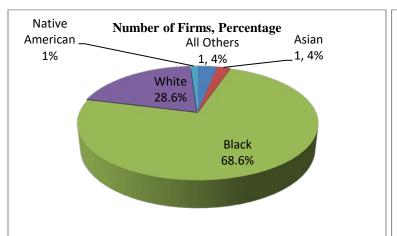

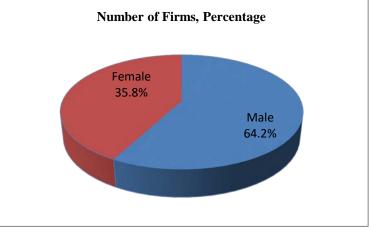

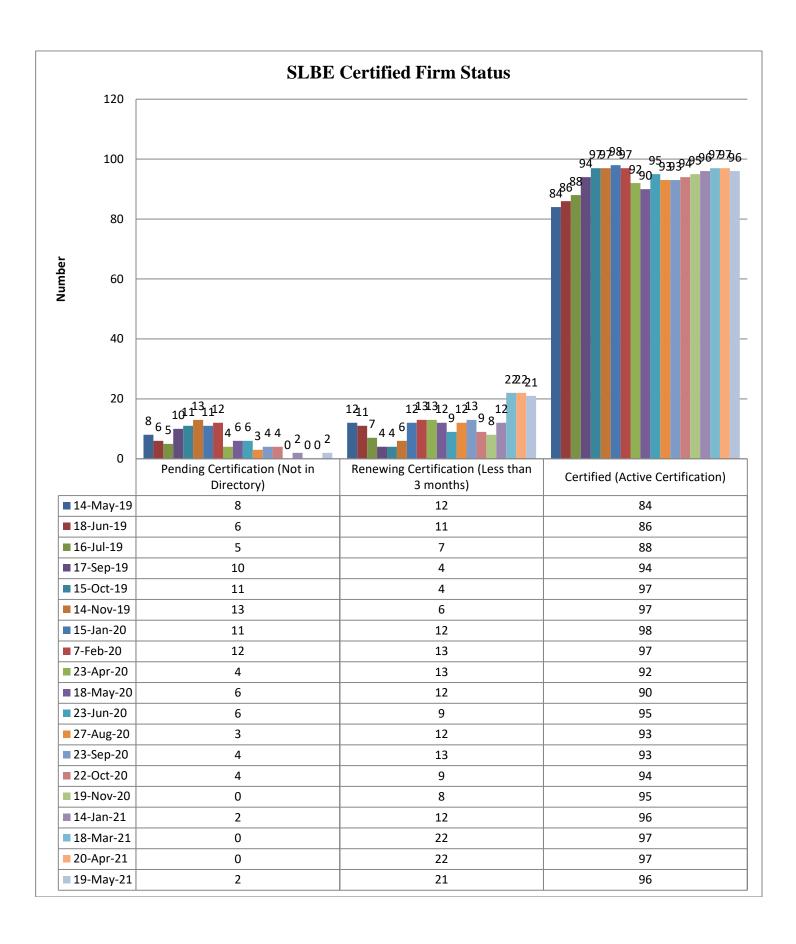


SLBE Firms by Ethnicity

Transportation Update- May 24, 2021

General Information

 Finance Manager-Transportation: An offer was made to one of the interviewed candidates and has been accepted. The Department is in the process of getting the new employee onboard.

Council Approvals

- City of Columbia Bikeway IGA approved on May 4th
- TIP 2 (Old Garners Ferry Rd.) award to Palmetto Corp. of Conway on May 4th
- Innovista Ph. 3 City of Columbia funding request approved on May 4th

Upcoming Committee Items For May 25th

- Three Rivers Boozer Property Conveyance to the City of Columbia
- Spears Creek Church Rd. Partial Rescope

Pre-Construction Update

- Atlas Road Widening Ph. 1 The City is working to obtain final encroachment permits from
 the two railroads for the proposed waterline construction in their ROWs. The Utility
 Coordinator has been in discussions with all other utilities to coordinate their construction
 schedules. Once this is finalized, the bid package can be completed and the project
 advertised.
- Bluff Rd. Widening Ph. 2 The OET is finalizing their scope and fee proposal.
- <u>Blythewood Widening</u>- Continue to work with property owners for update appraisals to complete ROW acquisition in order to move forward with the project.
- <u>Blythewood Improvements</u>- The Town discussed the intersection of McNulty and Boney at their April 26th meeting to go over the options of a roundabout vs. a four-way stop and voted to go with the four-way stop option. A public meeting has also been scheduled for May 26th to update citizens on all Blythewood projects. At this meeting, public input will be requested on the proposed Creech Rd. project.
- Broad River Road Widening- The OET has finalized their scope and is working on their fee
 proposal. The Irmo Administrator has reached out to staff and asked that we consider
 shortening the project to only be from Royal Tower to Koon Rd (instead of to Dutch Fork
 Rd) and to make this section 5 lanes. Staff is in the process of analyzing the cost to see if this

can be achieved in within the referendum amount.

- <u>Polo Road Widening</u>- The OET is working on the design.
- Shop Rd. Widening The OET is finalizing their scope and fee proposal.
- Spears Creek Church Road Widening- A traffic study has been completed and 3 lanes will be sufficient for the majority of the roadway, but 5 lanes is needed to address capacity issues between Earth Rd. and I-20. Staff is requesting that Council approve additional funding to provide the 5-lane widening in this area.
- <u>Bull/Elmwood Intersection</u>- Final ROW has been obtained. Utility plans are also being finalized. Bid documents are being prepared. CE&I services have been lined up for this project. Dominion is still having an issue obtaining an easement for their switch box. The City has been informed to see if they can assist with obtaining this easement.
- <u>Garners Ferry Rd\Harmon Rd Intersection</u> Council approved returning the project to its original scope. OET is preparing a fee proposal to perform Bid Phase Services. CE&I services have been lined up for this project.
- Broad River Rd. Corridor NIP SCDOT will be performing a safety improvement project
 along this corridor, and staff will be working with them to cover safety items that SCDOT
 will not have enough funding for. The County has already purchased overhead street signs to
 install at several intersections along this corridor, and SCDOT will have their contractor
 install them.
- <u>Dirt Road Package L OET</u> has finalized the design of three roads that will be included in this package: Wider Rd., Lake Dogwood Shores Cir., and Dogwood Shores Ln.
- Crane Creek Greenway- OET is developing final design fees for the project.
- <u>Gills Creek Greenway</u>- OET is under service order for design. Evaluating funds available and potential community meeting.
- <u>Smith/Rocky Branch Greenway</u>- OET is finalizing survey work. The City has approved the final alignment, and ROW plans are being finalized.
- <u>Sunset Road Sidewalk</u>- Working with OET to address remaining sewer and drainage issues.
 SCDOT still reviewing the plans.
- <u>Percival Road Sidewalk</u> OET is finalizing design and preparing bid documents.
- Alpine Road Sidewalk OET has submitted the plans for land disturbance permitting.

Construction Update

- <u>Decker/Woodfield NIP-Faraway Sidewalk</u>- Final walkthrough has been completed, and punchlist items are being addressed.
- North Springs/ Harrington Intersection: Staff is in the process of having the ROW obtained during design turned over to SCDOT.
- <u>Polo Road SUP</u>- Project is substantially complete. Performing work on final punch list items to include raising two fire hydrants.
- <u>Harrison Road Sidewalk</u>- Project is in closeout.
- <u>Innovista Phase II</u>- Approximately 35% complete. Substantial completion estimated for March 2022.
- <u>Clemson Road Widening</u>- Project is in closeout.
- North Main Street Street lighting nearing completion in Phase II and Phase III. Asphalt, curb and gutter, and sidewalks work performed between Sunset and Monticello. 95% complete.
- <u>Three Rivers Greenway</u> Project is 99% compete. Final as-built surveys completed.
 Coordinating with CSXT for section 1b construction access.
- Dirt Road Package K- Site clearing has started
- <u>SERN</u> Project is 95% complete. Projected completion will be summer 2021.
- Resurfacing Package Q- Project closeout.
- Resurfacing Package R- Pre-construction meeting was held and construction will begin at the beginning of June.
- <u>Clemson Rd.</u> Ph. 1 Sidewalk A pre-con was held on May 10th, and construction is anticipated to start June 15th.
- Old Garners Ferry Rd TIP 2 Staff is in the process of scheduling a pre-con.
