






SLBE Firms by Ethnicity

Pre-Construction Update

- <u>Atlas Road Widening Ph. 1</u> City Utility Relocation plans have been approved, and the City is working to obtain final easements for relocations. Utility Coordinator has been in discussions with all other utilities to coordinate their construction schedules.
- <u>Blythewood Widening</u>- Continue to work with property owners for update appraisals to complete RoW acquisition in order to move forward with the project.
- <u>Blythewood Improvements</u>- OET is working on construction plans for McNulty Street. RoW plans are completed and under review. The Town will discuss the intersection of McNulty and Boney at their April 26th meeting to go over the options of a roundabout vs. a four-way stop. A public meeting has also been tentatively scheduled for May 18th to update citizens on all Blythewood projects. At this meeting, public input will be requested on the proposed Creech Rd. project.
- Broad River Road Widening- The OET has finalized their scope and is working on their fee proposal.
- Polo Road Widening- The OET is working on the design.
- Spears Creek Church Road Widening- Under design. The entire road was originally proposed to be widened to 5 lanes but was descoped to only be widened to 3 lanes. A traffic study has been completed and 3 lanes will be sufficient for the majority of the roadway, but 5

- lanes is needed to address capacity issues between Earth Rd. and I-20. Staff may request Council approve additional funding to provide the 5-lane widening in this area.
- <u>Bull/Elmwood Intersection</u>- Final ROW has been obtained. Utility plans are also being finalized. Bid documents are being prepared. CE&I services have been lined up for this project.
- Shop Road Extension Phase 2- Working on scope updates in order to start design.
- <u>Crane Creek Greenway</u>- OET is developing final design fees for the project.
- <u>Gills Creek Greenway</u>- OET is under service order for design. Evaluating funds available and potential community meeting.
- <u>Smith/Rocky Branch Greenway</u>- OET is finalizing survey work. Additional survey may be required for utilities and trees. RoW plans have started.
- <u>Sunset Road Sidewalk</u>- Working with OET to address remaining sewer and drainage issues.
 SCDOT still reviewing the plans. Final RoW issues are being addressed.
- <u>Percival Road Sidewalk</u> OET is finalizing design and preparing bid documents.
- Alpine Road Sidewalk OET has submitted the plans for land disturbance permitting.
- <u>Garners Ferry Rd\Harmon Rd Intersection</u> Council approved returning the project to its original scope. OET is preparing a fee proposal to perform Bid Phase Services. CE&I services have been lined up for this project.
- <u>Dirt Road Package L</u> OET will be completing the design of several dirt roads in the next two weeks that will be included in this package.

Construction Update

- <u>Decker/Woodfield NIP-Faraway Sidewalk</u>- Final walkthrough has been completed, and punchlist items are being addressed.
- North Springs/ Harrington Intersection: Project is in closeout.
- <u>Polo Road SUP</u>- Project is substantially complete. Performing work on final punch list items to include raising two fire hydrants.
- <u>Harrison Road Sidewalk</u>- Project is in closeout.
- <u>Innovista Phase II</u>- Approximately 35% complete. Substantial completion estimated for March 2022.
- Clemson Road Widening- Project is in closeout.

- North Main Street Street lighting nearing completion in Phase II and Phase III. Asphalt, curb and gutter, and sidewalks work performed between Sunset and Monticello. 95% complete.
- <u>Three Rivers Greenway</u> Project is 99% compete. Final as-built surveys completed. Coordinating with CSXT for section 1b construction access.
- Dirt Road Package J- In close out.
- <u>Dirt Road Package K</u>- Site clearing has started
- <u>SERN</u> Project is 95% complete. Projected completion will be summer 2021.
- Resurfacing Package Q- Project closeout.
- Resurfacing Package R- Pre-construction meeting was held and construction will begin at the end of May.
- <u>Hardscrabble Road</u>- SCDOT updated that substantial completion is late in 2022. No change.

Over the past couple of months, The COMET has focused its planning efforts on adjusting to the "New Normal" of transit. The following planning activities from 03/29/2021 through 04/26/2021 are listed below:

- Finalizing contract for Lucius & River Superstop
- Started marketing for "How to ride Transit" for anticipated increase in UofSC ridership
- **Provided GIS training for staff**
- Continued to update performance metrics chart
- Sought out vendors for mapping Blue Bike travel patterns
- Scheduled plans to install bus shelters along the North Main corridor
- Conducted an audit of Trilliums bus stop inventory project
- Requested APC data for contracted routes for performance review
- Met with Thomas Kowalski from Urban Transport Associates to discuss federal approval of APC data
- Reviewed service change documents
- Assisted in designing a plan of action to implement Title VI & LEP
- Continued to prioritize shelter and bench placements throughout service area
- Continued revisions for NTD report
- Conducted site plan reviews
- Responded to customer route and bus stop request through solutions for transit
- Currently setting up Moovit dashboard now to push out service alerts and to gain new data
- Currently setting up our COMET Google Account with Google Transit to be ready to pushout new GTFS and GTFSRT

Reimagine The COMET

- The COMET officially launched the Reimagine The COMET planning effort on July 6, 2020 where local planners and staff representatives discussed community needs for transit. Elected officials were welcomed to join a daily 4 p.m. call to provide any additional feedback.
 - Using the project timeline listed below, The COMET is in the final stages of the public outreach phase. The Reimagine The COMET website was released to the public on September 1, 2020.
 - JWA is in the process of receiving input from the Board of Directors.
 - A presentation/work session is being organized for the Board of Directors to make final recommendation.
